

Sheboygan Area Bowling Association Hall of Fame Nomination - Women

Applicants Name

Applicant must have been a sanctioned bowler of SBA or Adult SABA for a minimum of 25 years; or if age 50, must have been a sanctioned member of Adult SABA for 10 years.

Bowler must also be in good standing with USBC and the Sheboygan Area Bowling Association.

Female bowlers must earn a total of 75 points to qualify for the Hall of Fame. All scores submitted must be USBC sanctioned.

Any high score achievement accomplished before 1993 is deemed an "Era Achievement" and bowlers will receive double the point value for that accomplishment.
